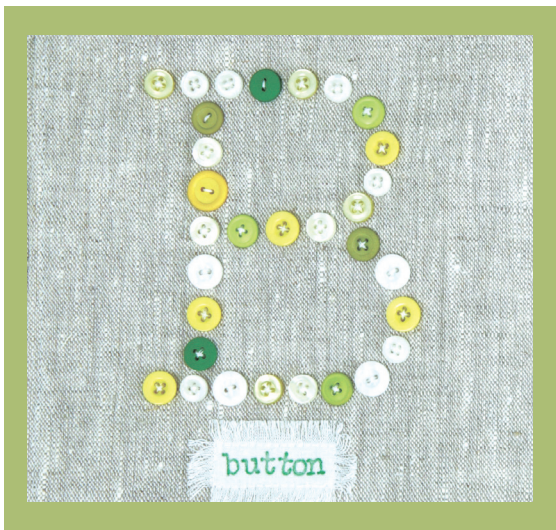

## “B” IS FOR BUTTON

Decorate with bright, fun buttons to create the B page.

### Supplies

- 8½" x 9¼" linen page backed with 8" square of interfacing
- Finished stamped word on linen (button), backed with fusible web
- Various coordinating buttons, (approximately ⅜" - to ½" - diameter buttons were used in the featured sample)
- 5" tall or smaller "B" template
- Removable fabric marker
- Tweezers
- Invisible fabric glue
- Yellow embroidery floss
- Hand sewing needle

### Prepare

Refer to [Letter Page Orientation List](#) to determine the 1" linen overhang placement. Fold the linen overhang to the wrong side temporarily to help center the letter and word.

Center the printed "B" and the stamped word "Button" on the linen page.

Using a hot dry iron, fuse the word onto the page following the manufacturer's instructions. Topstitch the stamped word perimeter ¼" from the edge. Use a pin or a seam ripper to



gently pull the threads from the linen up to the topstitching around the word to fray the edge. Trace the "B" template onto the linen right side using a removable fabric marker. Remove the template.

### Create

Place the buttons over the marked "B" before the ink disappears. Once satisfied with the button placement, pour a small amount of glue onto a piece of paper or cardboard. Using tweezers pick up each button, dip the back into the glue, wipe off any excess onto the paper or cardboard, and place the button back on the page (1).

When the buttons are dry hand stitch each one in place. ✂
