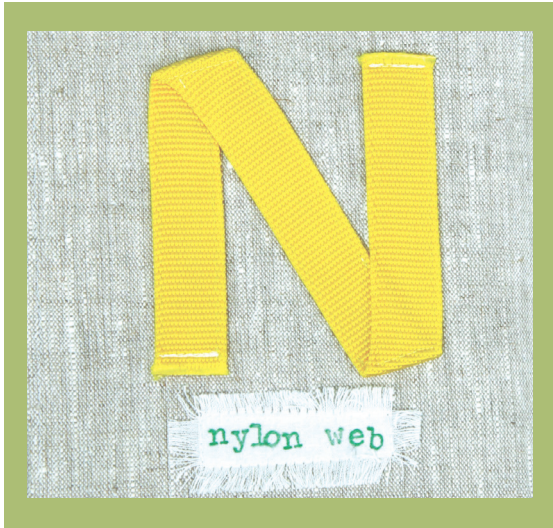


# SEWING

## “N” IS FOR NYLON

Make a neat letter “N” from nylon.

### Supplies

- 8½” x 9½” linen page backed with an 8” square of interfacing
- Finished stamped word on linen (nylon web), backed with fusible web
- 14½” length of 1”- wide nylon-web strapping
- 5” tall or smaller “N” template
- Removable fabric marker

### Prepare

Refer to [Letter Page Orientation List](#) to determine the 1” linen overhang placement. Fold the linen overhang toward the wrong side temporarily to help center the letter and word.

Center the printed “N” template on the page with the stamped word, “nylon web,” below it.

Using a hot dry iron, fuse the word onto the page following the manufacturer’s instructions.



Using a removable fabric marker, trace around the printed “N” template on the linen. Position the nylon webbing onto the linen, following the traced lines; pin to form an “N” (1).

### Create

Topstitch the “N” perimeter close to the edges. Topstitch the word to the page ¼” from the edge. Use a pin or a seam ripper to gently pull the threads from the linen up to the topstitching around the word to fray the edge. ∞
