## “Q” IS FOR QUILT

Make the smallest quilt for the “Q” page in your alphabet book.

### Supplies

- 8½”x9¼” linen page backed with 8” square of interfacing
- Finished stamped word on linen (quilt), backed with fusible web
- 6” square each of green linen, lightweight cotton batting & fusible web
- 5” tall or smaller “Q” template
- Removable fabric marker
- Cream embroidery floss
- Hand embroidery needle

### Prepare

Adhere the fusible web square to the green linen square wrong side, following manufacturer’s instructions. Remove the paper backing.

Place the green linen right side up over the batting square; fuse to secure using a hot dry iron.

### Create

Refer to [Letter Page Orientation List](#) to determine the 1” linen overhang placement. Fold the linen overhang toward the wrong side temporarily to help center the letter and word. Center the green linen square on the page;



pin. Select a satin stitch or zigzag stitch with a 1.2mm length and 1.5mm width. Stitch just inside the green linen edge to secure.

Position the stamped word on the edge of the green square (1).

Using a hot dry iron, fuse the word onto the page following the manufacturer’s instructions.

Select a straight stitch. Topstitch the stamped word perimeter ¼” from the edge. Use a pin or a seam ripper to gently pull the threads from the linen up to the topstitching around the word to fray the edge.

Center the template on the green square. Trace the letter using a removable fabric marker. Hand embroider the “Q” perimeter using four strands of embroidery floss and a running stitch. ∞
